UNIVERSITY OF AUCKLAND

Dr. M. P. K. Sorrenson and Dr. Nicholas Tarling have been appointed Professors of History. Dr. G. A. Wood, at present a Smuts Fellow at the University of Cambridge, and Dr. M. E. R. Bassett have been appointed Senior Lecturers. Mr. M. Brett has been promoted to Senior Lecturer, and Mr. M. R.
