James Bodell was born in 1831. At 16 he enlisted in the army and was sent first to Ireland and then to Hong Kong. He bought himself out of the army, went to Van Diemen's Land but eventually became disgusted with the atmosphere of a recent convict settlement. In 1856 he moved to Victoria but lost his money in unwise speculation during a period of excessive drinking. In 1863 he enlisted to serve in New Zealand in the Anglo-Maori Wars. Discharged in 1866, he was given land in TAURANGA where he became an outstanding pioneer, making money and becoming Mayor.

This is an amusing and very colourful account of the Empire seen from below.
