OCCASIONAL PAPERS IN ECONOMIC HISTORY

The series deals with the economic history of Papua New Guinea and related matters. Its purpose is to encourage research into Papua New Guinea's economic history, to facilitate the dissemination of relevant research findings, and to provide additional materials for the teaching of economic history at universities in Papua New Guinea and elsewhere. The editor would welcome manuscripts which might be suitable for publication in the series, up to a maximum length of about 20,000 words.
