### MRS HOBSON'S ALBUM

Auckland University Press reproduces for the first time this beautiful Album, given to Mrs Hobson on her departure from New Zealand in 1843 following the death of her husband. It contains 50 charming watercolours and drawings by well-known contemporary artists, two manuscript poems, letters from the Maori chiefs Te Wherowhero and Wiremu Hoete, and written examples of Maori customs, songs, and proverbs with comments by Edward Shortland.

Informative and perceptive essays by Elsie Locke on the Hobsons in New Zealand and Janet Paul on the artists and their work introduce the Album. The 64 colour plates, which include Maori portraits, landscapes, and scenes of early European settlement, are followed by an authoritative catalogue by Janet Paul. Both catalogue and essays include further illustrations from the period in black and white.

*Mrs Hobson's Album* is a unique memento of New Zealand in the 1840s.
