Graduate Essay Prize

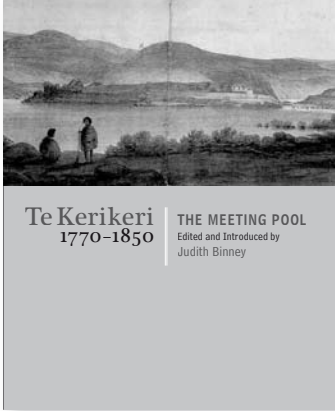
This prize was established by the Management Board of the *New Zealand Journal of History* to encourage graduate students to submit articles to the NZJH based on papers presented at the 2007 NZHA Conference.

To be eligible for the prize graduate students must present a paper at the 2007 New Zealand Historical Association conference and then rework the presentation into a journal article. They must submit the article to the NZJH by 1 February 2008. A committee of judges (drawn from the *Journal's* Editorial Advisory Group) will then select the winner. The winner will receive a two-year subscription to the *Journal* and \$200. Subject to satisfactory readers' reports the winning article may also be published.

The judges' decision will be final and no correspondence will be entered into.
