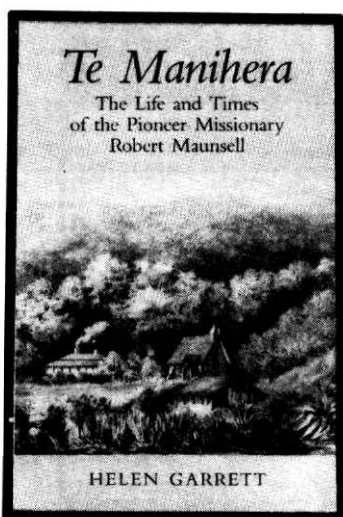

Robert Maunsell (1810–94) was one of New Zealand's most influential early missionaries. An Irish Protestant, he came to New Zealand in 1835 under the auspices of the Church Missionary Society.

Of especial interest are his encounters with some of the great personalities of the day, in particular his often difficult relationship with Bishop Selwyn, who is here revealed in a new light.
